Writer/director Tim Etchells, known to us from the British collective Forced Entertainment, has for the first time been working with a group of children aged 8 to 14. Etchells has written a play in which, with lots of humour and a lucidity that spares nothing and no one, he explores various schools of parenting, education, discipline and care.

Three actors from Germany and Latvia tell the stories of themselves and their fathers. They discover the comparable and the incomparable. They remember as sons and report as actors. They explore the connection of theatre and instinct, art and life, simulation and contradiction. In a collage of theatre and real life the actors tell the stories, how they got, what they are. This is touching, funny, terrifying and embarrassing - but always extremely loving.
